This week: DMR adventures Central PA DMR Repeaters May 2021

Steve N3FWE has prepared a list of DMR repeaters in Central PA. Some of these repeaters can be reached using a hand held transceiver -- "HT". Others require a better antenna such as a mobile or base station antenna and some will require a "hot spot" to make contact via the internet. We plan to post more articles on these concepts as the adventure continues.

Here is Steve's most recent list. Please note: The DMR world is constantly in flux. As changes occur we intend to update the list, so please check back from time-to-time for updates. Or as Steve says:

My codeplug is from scratch. I looked at others and did my code plug. I figured it was the best way to learn how to make one. I need to add a couple new repeaters to my code plug. Seems like it's always work in progress.

DMR seems to be gaining acceptance in the emergency management community.

Because DMR offers the ability to have two separate conversations taking place in the same bandwidth as one analog conversation, as well as the ability to send data and voice simultaneously, DMR has some clear advantages.

And I suspect that because DMR is, in many ways like NXDN, it may be easier to move traffic from an open, non-encrypted volunteer community using DMR to the "official", possibly encrypted, NXDN networks run by PEMA and others.

Most of these repeaters are DMR only, no analog mode.

The USER can select the "talk group".

If "local 2" is selected, then the first fourteen repeaters that are operational are tied together.

Go in one and out thirteen.

If "local 9" is selected , the output is only from the accessed DMR repeater.

If "Pa State" is selected, the output is from every DMR repeater in Pa. .

If "TAC XX" is selected, then two DMR repeaters can have a private QSO.

A hot spot is not needed at my QTH but I do use one to access Brandmeister Cross modes EPA net and Brandmeister talkgroups. If you plan on accessing Brandmeister talkgroups you will need an account there.

I'm able to access 5 or 6 local DMR repeaters. There is local traffic on the repeaters that don't require a hotspot. I check into the Sunday night local DMR net without a hotspot. There are a few nets on DMR. There is a PA Statewide talk group that is carried on all local repeaters.
