# Third Call Area Incoming QSL Bureau Sorters

If you have been on-the-air recently you know there has been a tremendous surge in DX activity especially on the 10 Meter band. If you have been working DX you should have the Incoming QSL Bureau in the back of your mind – make that the forefront of your mind.

Here is something to help jump-start the thought process. These are the people who sort your Incoming DX QSL cards. They are called Sorters – duh. Make the Sorter's job easier by having **Self-Addressed Stamped Envelopes** or **Money Account** funds on hand.
