CARC VHF Digital Net has switched its Op Mode to THOR 22 in place of DOMINO EX 22 (effective February 11, 2024).

THOR seems to be a more recognizable name in the world of Digital Modes. THOR evolved as a new and improved application that has DOMINO EX as its foundation. THOR improvements are in the area of Forward Error Correction (FEC).

The VHF Digital Net Control Station uses Reed-Solomon TxID option. Net Participants are encouraged to use the corresponding RxID option which can help them identify the specific digital mode that is being used.

Logging Software: N3FJP has a School Club Roundup logging application. And, the best news I can offer is to tell you that Scott and his company Affirmatech do not charge for this application. FREE FREE FREE

Simply download the School Club Roundup file from the www.N3FJP.com website You will find the School Club Roundup app behind the following hierarchy of menu names:
CONTEST LOGS, ARRL CONTEST LOGS,
SCHOOL CLUB ROUNDUP.

Execute the downloaded file on your PC and it will install the app. There is no software registration code required.

Contest Exchange:

RS(T) Received or RS(T) Sent,
Entry Category,
State/Province/DX Country.

Entry Categories are:

Individual
School
Club

For each QSO you will also need Your Call Sign, Date, Time, Band/Frequency, and RS(T) Sent for your log.

Contact Points:

Phone QSOs earn 1 point
CW QSOs earn 2 points
Digital QSOs earn 2 points

Multipliers:

a.) Count the number of US States worked.
Maximum of 50.

Count the number of Canadian Provinces and Territories worked. Maximum of 13.
AB, BC, MB, NB, NL, NU, NS, NT, ON,
PE, QC, SK, YT.

b.) Count the number of DX Entities (Countries) worked.

c.) Count the number of Schools worked and multiply by 5.

d.) Count the number of Clubs worked and multiply by 2.

Sum those five measurements. That is your multiplier.

Scoring:

The sum of all Contact Points multiplied by the sum of all Multipliers equals your score.

Submit your log using the ARRL Online application:

Other than doing so for your own curiosity, there is no need to calculate your score. The contest sponsor log checking application will compute your score.
