President John Luthy WA3KCP **welcomed** everyone to the 1st meeting of 2026, his first as president. He's excited about what this year has in store for us, a rejuvenation of the club. He spoke some thoughts from his **President's Letter, which will follow these minutes.**

John WA3KCP recalled that his father, Pops WD4PFJ, used to call radio club members that he met with "the smart guys" - hams, retired engineers, etc., on phone calls to John. Honoring Pops, John still learns things at every meeting. President Luthy thanked those who helped CARC exist and thrive for sixty years, and thanked Hoss's restaurant and wait staff. He asked the Secretary to give attendance numbers. We had fourteen in-person members attending, three members attending by Zoom, and three visitors. Guests included twelve-year-old Joseph DiMarco KD3CFE, and his father Michael KD3CJZ, who made their first CARC appearance. Dave Mitsky, a CARC spouse who once held a license, attended.

-) **Special Election** to fill the vacancy of the Vice-President position. Our former VP became President last November when the prior president stepped down. Charlene Cash WG3Q has acted as VP after a recommendation by then-President Frank Mellott KB3PQT and was voted in as VP at this meeting. Frank Mellott KB3PQT nominated, seconded by Garry Fasick K3EYK and Valli Hoski N8QVT.

-) **Birthdays** this month: A trio! Michael Migatulski KD3AEA, Doug Stenger KC3CPT, and Art Yingling WA3NQA. Congrats!

-) The **Membership Application** of Brian Hannon KC3TMW, sponsored by Frank KB3PQT was tabled, since Brian was not in attendance.

-) **Milestones:**

-) **Digital Two Meter Net** had a record attendance of six including Charlene WG3Q in her first check in. The net is at 6:00 p.m. local time, Sundays, 146.490 MHz, FM Simplex.¹

-) **POTA, Parks on the Air.** Doug Stenger KC3CPT is our top hunter. Mark Anstine KC3UVG and Paula Anstine KC3UVH are our top activators.

-) We have a new member of the **SKCC, The Straight Key Century Club**, Charlene Cash WG3Q. Charlene WG3Q was committed to make her first CW contacts, and she accomplished this! Two in fact.

-) Mike Wacker N3HR, a former member, **needs a tower climber** and reached out to CARC. It’s a 35-foot tower and he needs wire to be attached, in Mechanicsburg.

-) Officers put out a **four question survey** via the USPS and electronic medium. VP Charlene WG3Q is tabulating the results. Of note, Dave Hile W3VRE, now of Gloucester Virginia, renewed his membership after getting the survey. He wanted to keep in touch with us, the first radio club he had been a member of. A couple of other members were confused about CARC’s status or a their status in CARC. This suggests that the survey will be valuable.

-) Vice President Report by Charlene Cash WG3Q: The **survey** helped us to get an idea of what members are thinking and what they want. We had twenty-seven surveys returned, representing fifty-seven percent of members. This is enough of a response rate to be useful. Some survey ideas include:

-) Member preferences for **method of contact** was split between email and Groups-IO.

-) She thanked Andrew Forsyth AF3I for working to improve our **audio quality on Zoom** transmissions. It's complicated going, and the military term "No plan survives first contact'." seemed relevant.

-) Frank KB3PQT thought about a straight key night.
-) John McCown has introduced the club to **Slack**, an online communication and productivity tool, via email and Groups-IO. He gave a presentation at this meeting, placed at the end of the minutes.
-) Valli N8QVT reported learning about **Echolink**, which she said was new and exciting. You can use a cellphone to talk to on-the-air buddies.
-) **CARC dues are due.** Pay with a check to Doug Stenger KC3CPT or contact Andrew Forsyth AF3I for electronic payment methods. Send Andrew AF3I a message at AF3I@radioclub-carc.com and he'll send a payment link. After March 31, dues are delinquent.
-) Bob Bennett KV3K won the **drawing** and was given a can of WD-40 spray.

For others, the meeting will be carried online as a Zoom Web Meeting. Our goal is to open the Zoom connection by 6:30 p.m. so the Zoom audience can be ready for the 6:40 p.m. start.

We had two presentations:

1) Charlene Cash WG3Q gave an informative and entertaining presentation about her **hexbeam antenna** and her adventures erecting and maintaining it. (A hexbeam, AKA a hexagonal-beam, AKA a 'W-antenna,' is a directional antenna functioning akin to a two beam YAGI. Each driven element is a half lambda long wire and is "W" shaped. The reflecting wire is "U" shaped.) Hers has a twenty foot diameter, six spreader arms which hold the wires, about twenty pounds of weight, and about five square feet wind resistance. She got it used at a hamfest. She set a 4 by 4" post in concrete and put the antenna atop a thirty foot push-up mast, with a rotator. It's now on her roof. A TV antenna rotator could be used given the light weight. She's delighted the low noise floor compared to her off-center fed dipole. Gain about 5-6 dBi. It's 20-30 dB front to back. She recommends that hams have a vertical, a horizontal dipole, and a directional antenna since they serve different purposes.

Bands are: 20, 17, 15, 12, and 10. She recommends the website <https://www.Hex-Beam.com> (there is a hyphen between hex and beam) for information on building a hexbeam antenna.

2) Jon McCown KC3ZYD spoke about **Slack**. This is an online communication and productivity tool, popular with home users and businesses. He has established an account for CARC. With the free version, material lasts only thirty days and there are no AI or bots. It's faster than email, good for quick things like satellite work. It's easy to have conversations with others who have various interests, as well as outside groups. He follows Meshtastic and Raspberry Pi stuff, for instance. He Slack-chats with some local hams who live close by. To get on Slack and try it out, give Jon a contact and he'll invite you.

-Charlene WG3Q led a discussion of New Year's Resolutions.
